




#### Psalm 5: 1-3 (NIV)

Listen to my words, Lord, consider my lament.


Hear my cry for help, my King and my God, for to you I pray.

In the morning, Lord, you hear my voice; in the morning I lay my requests before you and wait expectantly.




It was about this time that King Herod arrested some who belonged to the church, intending to persecute them. He had James, the brother of John, put to death with the sword. When he saw that this met with approval among the Jews, he proceeded to seize Peter also. This happened during the Festival of Unleavened Bread. After arresting him, he put him in prison, handing him over to be guarded by four squads of four soldiers each.



Herod intended to bring him out for public trial after the Passover.


So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him.

The night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries stood guard at the entrance.





When this had dawned on him, he went to the house of Mary the mother of John, also called Mark, where many belone had gathered and work reasoning.




"You're out of your mind," they told her. When she kept insisting that it was so, they said, "It must be his angel."






#### Matthew 6: 5-8 (NIV)




#### Matthew 6: 5-8 (NIV)
